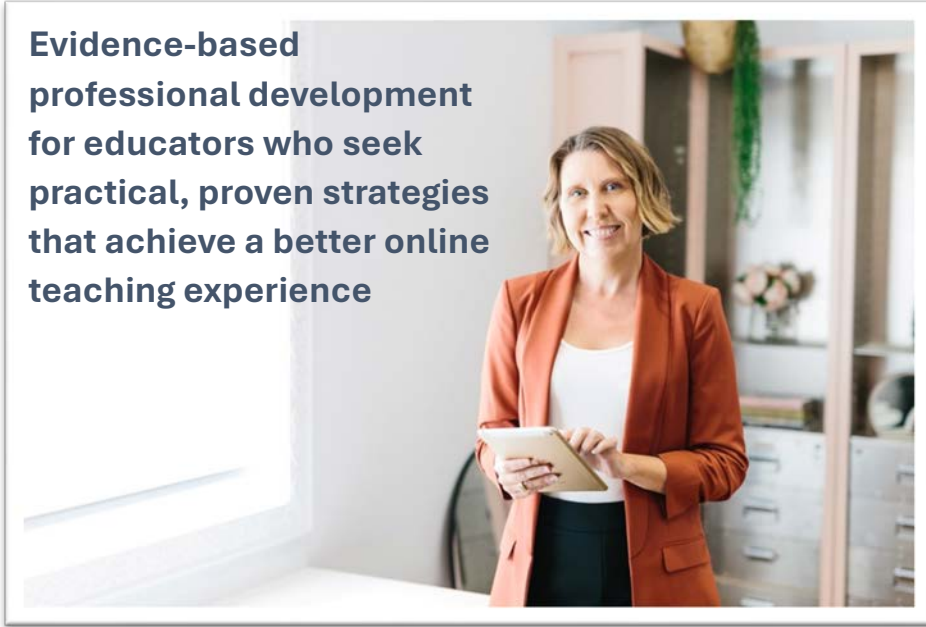

□ Learner digital skills (35-min set)

Learner Digital Skills are the hot topic in vocational education and workplace training right now, and for good reason! Digital Skills have been identified as a barrier for many learners seeking to engage with learning opportunities. This isn't an online versus on-campus discussion. Regardless the format being delivered, digital skills are necessary for participation in education today.

Not only are aspiring learners impacted, but so are educators and trainers. I researched this issue for two years, and found that up to 87% of teaching workload in some weeks is being spent on providing remedial digital skill support. Educators reported that support provision is outside their job role, their expertise, and the scope of content assigned for them to deliver.

To address learner and educator challenges, a **Good Practice Guide** has been developed for vocational education and workplace training providers. It contains 10 guidelines to inform your selection and implementation of digital skills support systems.
